The past tense in the if-clause does not show past time.

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Second Conditional Sentences - English Grammar Exercises

This type 2 second conditional is used to talk about the situation now, not in the past although we use the simple past tense in the if-clause.The situation we express is imaginary, unlikely or hypothetical, and is therefore unlikely to happen now or in the future. The second conditional uses the simple past tense in the if-clause and the present conditional in the main clause.

The second clause of subject + would + verb (conditional verb) is conditional to the first clause happening (or will only happen if the first part/clause happens). Example: If I won the lottery, I would travel around the world. = It is unlikely that I will win the lottery, but I'm going to hypothetically imagine that I did win.

Second Conditional - English Grammar

The Second Conditional. The second conditional uses the past simpleafter if, then 'would' and the infinitive: if + past simple, ...would + infinitive. (We can use 'were' instead of 'was' with 'I' and 'he/she/it'. This is mostly done in formal writing). It has two uses.

First and second conditionals - Test-English

Second conditional - table - If clause and main clause. We use if + past to talk about an imaginary present or future situation (although the verb is in past, the meaning is present or future). And we use would + infinitive to talk about the result or consequence of that imaginary situation. If we had a mansion in the country, we' d go there every weekend.
